AC Replacement Update

AC Replacement Update...We are still waiting for Carrier, the manufacturer of the sanctuary unit, to fix the issue we are having with cooling the sanctuary. The issue is covered under the warranty, so there is no additional cost to the church. Our final payment to DeBra-Kuempel will be made once the sanctuary air is working correctly. We do appreciate everyone’s patience as we wait for the sanctuary air to work properly. Beyond working with Carrier on our behalf, DeBra-Kuempel has been sending a technician outside of regular contract hours early on Sunday mornings to make sure the sanctuary is cool for our worship services. **We appreciate their help as we wait for Carrier to come up with a solution for the issue the unit is having.**

As of July 27th, we have received \$58,336 from the congregation, enough to complete the entire AC replacement project. Since we have reached our goal to complete the project, the AC Replacement Fund is officially closed. We thank everyone who contributed to the AC Fund including the Hebron Lutheran Foundation. Thanks to your faithfulness and generosity we completely paid the \$311,836 for this entire project in less than a year and without obtaining a loan. **We give God all the glory and praise for providing the means for this capital improvement!**
